

Our legislators are back and back again to the drawing board. This week, our legislators returned to Tallahassee and submitted their third attempt in as many years to redraw many of the state congressional districts required by the Florida Supreme Court. The "Supremes" recently ruled on July 9th that the 2010 legislature's re-districting was "Unconstitutional and Discriminatory, " violating the Voting Rights Act of 1964. We've reported on this before (click here to see CAN Alert: Crayons Anyone?), but now we're in the middle of another Special Session and tensions are flaring. Today's CAN Alert will bring you up to speed on the drama in the statehouse (Big House).

The proposed map of new districts will lead to a dramatic shift of Florida's political landscape, and many incumbent legislators-democrats and republicans alikeare not happy. While the Special Session ends August 21st, lawsuits are now being filed on both sides of the aisle as legislators try to hold on to their preferred previously drawn lines in the sand. A spokeswoman for Jacksonville Democrat Corrine Brown told the Tampa Bay Times she would file a lawsuit to keep District 5 as it currently stands. Republicans are just as outraged. U.S. Congressional Representative Republican Daniel Webster implored the state representatives to vote down the new map as well.

Florida State Senate Democratic Leader Arthenia Joyner of Tampa, dismissed both republican and democratic complaints, said it best to a reporter from the Tampa Bay Times: "Politics. Everyone wants to protect their own territory. That's how we got into this mess."
